Literacy

- Proficiency for all students/all grades on ISASP has remained steady and varied between 69.60% 71.63% proficient since 2018-2019.
- Third graders remain our lowest performing grade level on ISASP at 33.15% not yet proficient.
- 8th graders are our highest performing grade level at 75.69% proficient.

Math

- Proficiency for all students/all grades on ISASP has remained steady and varied between 66.09% 71.85% proficient since 2018-2019.
- Ninth graders are our lowest performing grade level on ISASP at 37.94% not yet proficient.
- Third graders are our highest performing grade level at 75.17% proficient.

Science

• Proficiency in science has steadily increased across all grade levels over the past 5 years from 58.09% proficient to 64.11% proficient.

The gaps continue to remain fairly steady for the past 3 years in both literacy and math in all sub-groups.

Increase annual graduation rates

The graduation rate trendline in HeartlandAEA school districts has decreased slightly (1.62%).

Heartland AEA's graduation rate is 1.1% above the state average of 89.86%

Increase gateways to post-secondary success

HAEA area students' intention to enroll in post-secondary education steadily declined from 80.40% in 2015 to 72.90% in 2022. However, there was an increase of 1.2% between 2021 and 2022. HAEA is 1.7% above the state average of 71.2% intending to enroll.

From 2015 to 2021 the enrollment of HAEA students in a post secondary program within 1 year of high school graduation decreased from 70.10% to 62.90%. This is a decrease of 7.2% of students enrolling. HAEA is 1.4% above the state average of 61.5% of students enrolling in a post secondary program within a year of graduation.

Students persisting for a second year of post-secondary education is trending down in HAEA. In 2015, 61% of students returned for a second year in comparison to 54.20% of students in 2020 (the last year of data we currently have). This is a downward trend of 6.8% fewer students returning for the second year. In comparison to the state average (51%), HAEA is 3.2% higher.

HAEA students completed their post secondary education within 6 years of high school graduation at a rate of 48.70%. The state average is 47.9%.





Post-Secondary Trendline Data - HeartlandAEA


HeartlandAEA High School Graduation Rate




HeartlandAEA Intention to Enroll in Post Secondary Education




HeartlandAEA enrollment in post secondary education within 1 year of high school graduation

Federal Designations

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Targeted Assistance

- Ensures that vital information is provided to educators, families, students, and communities through annual statewide assessments that measure students' progress toward those high standards.
- Helps to support and grow local innovations—including evidence-based and place-based interventions
 developed by local leaders and educators.
- Sustains and expands this administration's historic investments in increasing access to high-quality preschool.
- Maintains an expectation that there will be accountability and action to effect positive change in our lowest-performing schools, where groups of students are not making progress, and where graduation rates are low over extended periods of time.

Each Iowa Area Education Agency (AEA) provides required, direct support to all Targeted and Extended Targeted schools. In addition, each Iowa AEA provides required, direct support in collaboration with the Iowa Department of Education for all Comprehensive and Extended Comprehensive schools (currently 8). There are 121 targeted schools in Heartland AEA.

Individuals with Disabilities Education Act - Differentiated Accountability (IDEA-DA) Assistance

IDEA-Differentiated Accountability (IDEA-DA) is a continuous monitoring cycle that includes compliance and results elements aligned with federal and state requirements for special education programs. IDEA-DA maintains a primary focus on improving educational results and functional outcomes for all students with disabilities and ensuring compliance with Part B, with particular emphasis on those requirements most closely related to improving educational results for students with disabilities. Different data sources and methods are used to monitor LEAs annually. The information collected is reviewed, verified and publicly reported annually in the Annual Performance Report (APR). Specific State Performance Plan (SPP) indicators require a review of data for all LEAs each year with follow-up reviews for LEAs below the state targets.

lowa's monitoring activities focus on improving performance outcomes as well as correcting noncompliance. LEAs can expect monitoring activities and technical assistance with an emphasis on strengthening, adjusting and/or correcting in fiscal, program practices and management. Monitoring activities include: data collection, verification, reporting and improvement activities. Technical Assistance and support are designed to help the LEA to strengthen program management, processes, implementation and other areas identified through monitoring data. lowa has designed three differentiated levels of support to meet the needs of the LEAs to improve educational results and functional outcomes for all students with disabilities. With this in mind, The Department, in collaboration with stakeholders, developed three levels of support that all require actions that translate into system steps toward improved outcomes for students with disabilities: Level 1, Level 2, Level 3. IDEA-DA's tiered levels represent the intensity of resources needed for special education program improvement to meet the needs of students with disabilities and improved outcomes, with Level 3 being the highest level of intensity.

Examples of Targeted Support Based on Above Designations

Heartland's three districts with a Level 3 determination, identified district team members to participate in completing the IDEA-DA Data Review Protocol. The most up to date Data Review Protocols (DRP) are linked:

- DRP- Secondary Transition
- DRP-Literacy

Districts receiving level 3 support completed the DRP in May of 2023. The AEA Regional Director serving the district facilitated the data conversation with support from Department staff. All facilitated data conversations are completed on-site with the district.

Each of the three districts worked with the AEA Regional Director to complete an Implementation Plan outlining their actions to address the area of focus based on their review of the data. For each of the districts, the AEA will specifically support professional learning around the identified SDI professional learning package aligned to their area of focus and goal. This professional learning began in the fall of 2023.
